# Sufferings: To desire for in a post Covid-19 era!

If we never understood what suffering was - no better season to have a grasp about it than these unprecedented times we are living in. Over a million infected by the epidemic, thousands mourning the loss of their loved ones, innumerous stranded on the road & unfamiliar territories, many going through mental stress & anguish, the poor pushed to further poverty, lacking food & basic necessities of life, economy crashing, world leaders fighting against time to mitigate loss of precious lives. Not just individuals/families but nations and the world on the whole is suffering. Even in times such as these, it's pertinent to know that the Word categorises sufferings into 2 categories at a high level: One that we have been given authority to claim victory over. Unfortunately, most people spend their entire life battling these sufferings failing to understand the criterion to leading a victorious life. On the other hand, the second category is suffering that's inevitable in the life of a true Christian. Romans 8:17 reminds us that if we are the children of God, then we would indeed share in His suffering.

So the first question is - Am I truly a child of God? We can answer that question in the light of John 1:12, Galatians 3:26 and 1 John 3:1. For those of us who would answer it as Yes, the natural consequence of it is that our hearts would be so aligned with what the heart of God beats for - to the point that we would consider it the greatest privilege to be found worthy of sharing in His suffering. All of us have our share of suffering in our lives. But the more relevant question is: Your sufferings are - for the sake of? The Word tells us in: 2 Timothy 1:8 - So do not be ashamed of the testimony about our Lord or of me his prisoner. Rather, join with me in suffering for the gospel (for the sake of the Good News), by the power of God.

2 Corinthians 12:10 - That is why, for Christ's sake, I delight in weaknesses, in insults, in hardships, in persecutions, in difficulties. For when I am weak, then I am strong. Therefore as we learn some important lessons through these testing times, it's my prayer that we will come out of it - in a post Covid-19 era - longing to share in His sufferings (For Christ's sake and for the sake of the Gospel/Good News). Over every other suffering that may come about in our lives, God equips a born-again child of God to have victory by: Confessing our sins, turning from wicked ways and returning back to God.Psalms 32:5, 2 Chronicles 7:14, Proverbs 28:13, 1 John 1:9 Seeking His face and be drawn close to Him in prayer. Hebrews 11:6, Mathew 6:33, Psalm 9:10, 1 John 5:14-15, Jer 29:12 Surrendering your life and choosing to live in obedience to God's Word.Deut 28:1, Deut 5:33, Luke 9:23, Phil 2:5-8, 1 Peter 5:6-10

Meditating on the Word and claiming the promises in them. Joshua 1:8, Phil 4:8, 2 Peter 1:4, 2 Tim 3:16-17, Mathew 28:20, 1 John 5:4 Understanding the power in the blood of Jesus Christ and invoke deliverance through it. Col 1:20, Ephesians 1:7, Rev 7:14, Rev 12:11 Those that long to share in His suffering, to them God gives the promise of also sharing in His glory. To study what's in store for a believer as part of sharing in His glory - is the most exciting bible study one can ever take up. What a joyful day that would be when my Lord & my Savior, the King of kings and the Lord of lords - with the shout of the archangel and sound from the trumpet of God - would come to take me home. May we be encouraged today that the Lord provides us protection & victory over every pestilence & danger just as the Israelites found safety even as the angel of death passed over their homes in the land of Egypt. # **AGENG AND THE COMMUNITY**

In India as well as across many other countries, the population above 60 years of age is fast growing. It was usual in the past to characterize the later years as periods of gloom and despondency. However, in the West today the perspective has altered considerably. The golden years are now regarded as the "third age" when older persons can pursue an active lifestyle. There is no denying that aging does bring about changes in bodily systems and psychological aspects. Hearing and visual deficits, slowing of motor processes, changes in memory and reduced communication network are common problems in older adults. However, with the advent of technological advances and improved health care systems, they can hope to lead productive and independent lives.

The late UN Secretary, Kofi, while referring to the aging population had observed: "Trees grow stronger over the years, rivers wider and likewise with age, human beings gain immeasurable depth, breadth of experience and wisdom. That is why older persons should not only be respected and revered but they should be utilized as the rich resource to society that they are". Long life is a reward for obedience to the statutes laid down by the Lord (1 Kings 3:14; Deutro. 5:33, 11:21). In Psalm 91:16, the promise is that He would satisfy His people with long life and show them His salvation. Abraham was assured that he would go to the grave at a good old age (Gen. 15:15). Indeed the fear of the Lord adds length to life (Prob. 10:27). The Lord also promises to sustain the faithful even to their old age and gray hairs (Isa.46:4).

The Biblical depiction of Moses and his call to lead a huge number of Israelites across hostile territory and wastelands -to the promised land- stands as a lasting testimony. He was over 70 years when he began the daunting journey with the unfaithful, complaining mass of Israelites who were ready to stone him even for small issues. He stood tall and strong, soaring under the wings of the Lord, till his end at 120 years of age (Deutro. 34:7) even as the destination came into sight.

Today, as ever before, it is expedient to ensure the wellbeing of older persons in the family and community. Providing a supportive environment contributes to better psychological health of older adults. With aging there is difficulty in hearing in noisy environments; problems in understanding and responding quickly; difficulty in remembering names and in retaining information besides a host of other issues. Family members often misunderstand the lapses and confusion of older persons, resulting in conflicts in the home. On the contrary, the kin should show empathy towards the physical, social and emotional difficulties that older persons may be experiencing. It is vital to include them in family activities and to motivate them to engage themselves; such measures could forestall deterioration in memory, cognition and other skills. Appropriate aids and devices to cope with their health care needs may also be warranted.

In the community, efforts should be expended to optimize opportunities for the physical, social and mental health of the older adults; this would enable their active participation and improve their quality of life. Though aging individuals are vulnerable as a group, it must be kept in mind that "grey hair is a crown of splendor, attained by a righteous life" (Prov. 20:29).
