DECADE CELEBRATIONS HOLY LAND TRIP

The first delegation of Shelter House left for the Holy Land on the 9th of October. By the grace of God we were able to begin our tour from Amman, Jordan. It was a privilege to begin our journey from the east side of Jordan, along the same route the people of Israel once took to reach the Promised Land. We saw the Jordan valley from the heights of Mt. Nebo, taking in the sight that filled the eyes of 120-year old Moses. We were able to have a look at the oldest available map of the Bible land at Madaba and float on the waters of the Dead Sea.

We entered into the borders of Israel, visiting Mt. Tabor, the Mount of Transfiguration, Nazareth, the hometown of Mary and Joseph. The land of Israel is indeed a prosperous land filled with the bounty of heaven. Each day began and closed with worship and prayers. We couldn't help but be in awe as we visited the synagogue in Capernaum where Jesus preached, the famous Mount on which He preached the Beatitudes and Tabgha where the multiplication of five loaves and two fish took place. It was a blessed opportunity to sail on the Sea of Galilee, where Jesus once walked on its waters.

Our next destination on the tour took us to David's tomb, Mt. Zion from where Jesus Christ will reign as King very soon and then onto Bethlehem where we were able to see the Nativity church, Shepherd's field and meditate on story of Ruth and Boaz. The last day in Israel was definitely a day filled with activity! It was the whole day dedicated in walking in and around Jerusalem. We were able to visit the Western wall and pray there at that incredible atmosphere. We began at the Mount of Olives where Jesus wept over Jerusalem, from where He ascended to heaven and that is where He will be coming back again. From there we took the steep road down to the



garden of Gethsemane, passing by the tombs of Prophets at the Kidron Valley. Walking through the narrow market streets of Jerusalem, we couldn't bear to imagine the agony Jesus went through as He passed Via Dolorosa carrying the heavy cross all for the redemption of mankind. The 14 Stations of the Cross leads you outside the city gates of Jerusalem where Golgotha stands where Jesus was crucified. We could view this from the garden tomb which holds the empty tomb of Jesus and this was the beautiful end to our stay in Israel. The garden tomb gave us hope and the much needed motivation to finish the mission God has called us to complete.

The last part of the journey was through the Sinai Peninsula onto Egypt. We were able to visit the pyramids, Sphinx and Coptic churches in Egypt and learn about their life ever since civilization began. This helped us get an idea of how Moses was brought up in Egypt and how bad slavery of 430 years must have been for the Israelites. Our time in Egypt brought with it a new perspective on the living for the Lord when living in a world of sin. The baptism of Tirzah and Hannah along with fifteen others was a highlight of this tour as Pastor Ashley conducted the baptism in the Yardenite Baptismal site. After 10 days of living in the land where the Bible comes alive, we returned back with fire burning in our spirits to live evermore radically to the glory of God because if everything recorded in the Bible has been true so far, then what is to come will surely come to pass as the Bible says so.

CHRISTMAS PRESENCE



Greetings in the name of our Lord Jesus. I'm Sankavi, a Hindu born girl but saved by Christ at the age of 14. Right from my young age, I was brought up in the faith of the Lord. As my family was serving idols before salvation, we had lot of struggles in overcoming the curses that were implanted through our ancestors but my family had overcome everything by prayer and fasting. Growing up seeing the faith of my purents and the grace of our Lord Jesus upon my family, I was too dependent on my parents for prayer. Even after getting marvied, I depended much on my parent's prayer but that didn't work in my family life.



After 2 years of married life we still didn't have children. We visited the doctor for fertility treatment. Month after month with great pain, we visited the doors of hospital by putting our faith in doctors which led us to stay fur away from faith and prayer. This created alot of fights and chaos in my family which even led to thoughts of separation. But our Lord didn't leave us. He spoke to us through our Pastor's sermon that definitely we are going to have a baby naturally. Waiting for that day, we re-started our family prayer calling onto our Lord and within a month I got conceived but that baby didn't even last for a month and it was aborted due to wrong medication and we were completely distressed. Amidst the pain of losing the baby we started trusting in God's promise that He would give us a child naturally. We stopped visiting hospital and we started putting our faith in our Lord. Our faith didn't fail. Again I was conceived naturally and here we have our little baby Nivaan in our hands who is already 11 months old. Having a baby now-a-days is really an uphill struggle for people with infertility problem but that's not the case for people with faith in God. Praising God for all His mercies.


